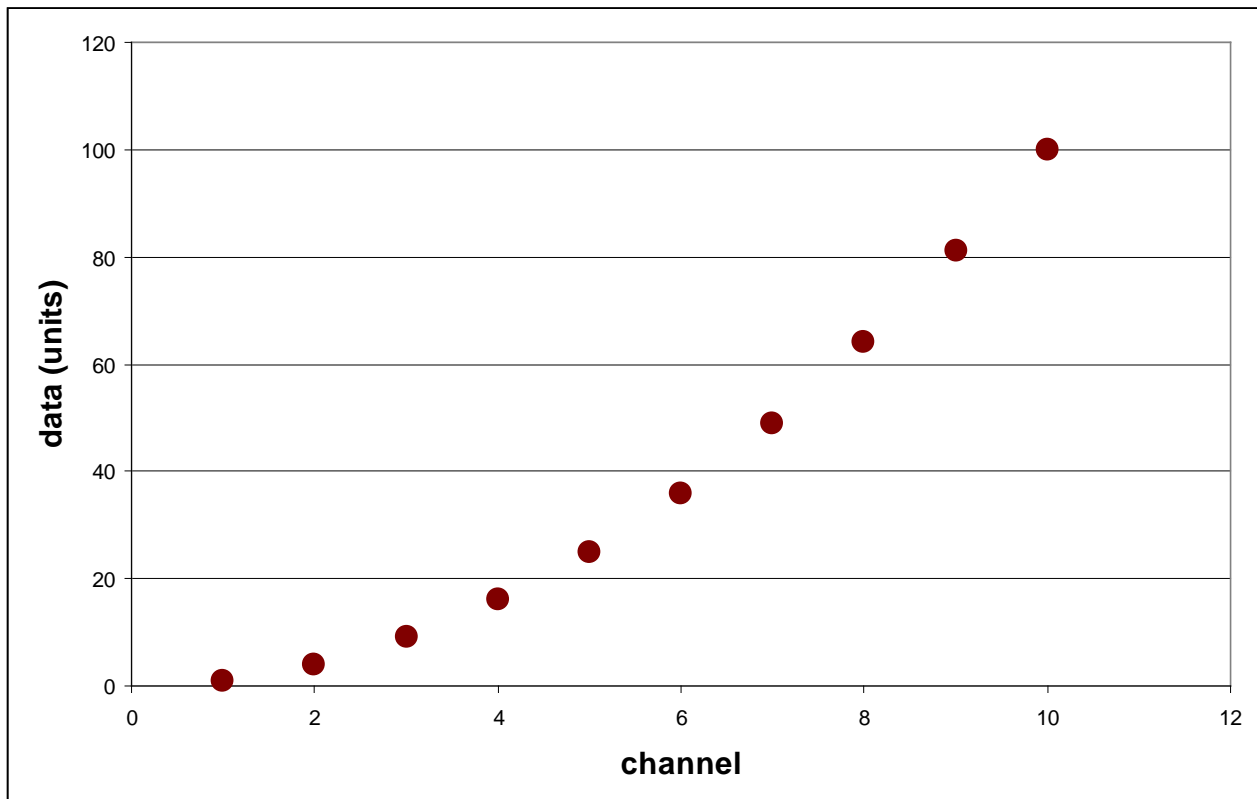

Example citations in text: e.g. '(Smith 1985, Jones 1986, Trevor *et al.* 1987, Bloggs *et al.* 2001)' [refs cited in chronological order, *et al.* to be used for two or more authors] or 'see Smith (1985)'.

Please use times new roman, 9pt, small caps for the names, left justified with 3pt spacing before and after each reference (highlight reference list, right click mouse, select PARAGRAPH, in the section entitled "spacing" set the before and after spacing to 3pt).

## Guidelines for writing your paper

- For all manuscripts non-discriminatory language is mandatory. Sexist or racist terms should not be used.
- The length of the manuscript is not permitted to exceed four pages in length.
- The working language of the conference is English and we would prefer papers to be submitted in English.
- Manuscripts should follow this style template.
- Abstracts of not more than 200 words are required for all papers submitted.
- Manuscripts should be compiled in the following order: title page; abstract; keywords; main text; acknowledgments; references;
- Section headings should be concise and numbered sequentially, using a decimal system for subsections to no more than three layers (e.g. 4, 4.1, 4.1.1).
- Authors must adhere to SI units. Units are not italicised.
- When using a word which is or is asserted to be a proprietary term or trade mark authors must use the symbol ® or TM.
